Juniors Get Going!

Remember to challenge yourself in your classes, and know what constitutes rigorous core. Take classes that relate to your future career plans.

<u>September</u> - Register to take the PSAT in October. It gives you a leading edge when you take the ACT in the spring!

<u>October</u> - Attend a few college/ trades recruiting presentations in the Career Center this year. **November** - Take the ASVAB Test to learn your strengths.

January - Begin to research schools that may be a good fit for you. Be in contact with their coaches if you are interested in playing a college sport.

February - Check for required college entrance tests such as the SAT/ACT. Make plans with parents and school counselors to visit colleges/trade schools over spring break or the fall.

<u>March</u> - Practice for the ACT and make the FREE FHS ACT Test for all Juniors count for YOU! Visit college/trade schools! Take the ASVAB Test.

April - Take the ACT! Meet with your school counselor to be sure you're on track for graduation next year.

<u>May</u> - Find a summer job through the FHS Employment Office that will boost your skills in a field you hope to pursue.

Seniors ... Final Countdown!

Get ready for the best year yet!

SEPTEMBER: Make a plan! Register to take the SAT or ACT again to better your scores, attend the College Fair, meet with your counselor and stay on track! Finalize your resume. Get on those college/trades school applications and **begin notifying teachers** for letters of recommendation NOW!

OCTOBER: Complete the FAFSA for priority financial aid consideration and ask for financial aid and scholarship information from prospective colleges and trade schools. Work on your personal essay for applications! Order current transcript at Guidance or Career offices.

NOVEMBER: Make a closing decision regarding private schools and a tentative decision for state schools.

<u>DECEMBER:</u> Pick up a Scholarship Directory in the Career Center!

JANUARY: Watch for the scholarship season to open. Prepare for applications requiring an essay.

FEBRUARY: Apply for as many local and community scholarships as possible. Contact colleges/trades schools you've applied, and make sure they have received all of your information.

MARCH: Check on final college/trades school deposits. Follow through on completing scholarship applications by due dates!

APRIL: Select housing and meal plans for college and trades school.

MAY: Take Senior Exit Survey, apply for graduation distinctions, attend Scholarship Awards Event May 24, and look forward to graduation!

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATIONAre you interested in the trades, vocational training & skill development?

Transform your future with career and technical training in 2-year certificate programs or prepare for college with work-based learning right here at FHS! Student groups in business (BPA, DECA), agriculture (FFA), healthcare (HOSA) and the trades (SkillsUSA) provide opportunities for leadership and competition. Get real work experience at the Southside Coffee Shop, the Kalispell Student Built Home, in culinary arts or operating heavy equipment. Within FHS classes, students can receive credit in early childhood care and welding; certification in CPR, ServSafe Food Service, National Tractor Safety, OSHA 10 & S/P2 Pollution Prevention and Automotive Service Excellence; and apprentice hours in the building trades. Ask your counselor about classes and watch for apprenticeship, trade school and employer visits to the career center!
